Thank you for your recent letter regarding our 'Plantastic' exhibition.

We've revisited the 'Thorney Issues' section in response to your comments. The section presents different viewpoints and gives the viewer the choice to agree or disagree with each statement. The final screen says 'Some people believe that GM plants are an important part of our future and will help to feed the world. Others think we are meddling with nature and GM foods could be dangerous. What do you think?' The purpose of the exhibition is to engage young people and stimulate discussion and we feel that the display meets this criteria.

The exhibition will be closing on 1st November so it wouldn't be practical for us to amend information now.
